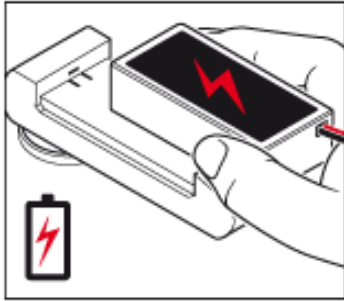

the battery before you start

Update your Drone

ensure your Drone has the latest software, to check and update it, go to the FreeFlight 3 application

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS



Never lose sight of your Drone



Do not approach or film people without their consent
Be very careful & respect privacy when using the camera, the pilot may be classed a public nuisance if people's privacy is not considered



Do not fly higher

than 120 metres if you are in controlled airspace, which covers most Australian cities



Do not fly within

5.5 km of an airfield, nor near military bases, industrial zones and other sensitive areas

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS



Do not fly over

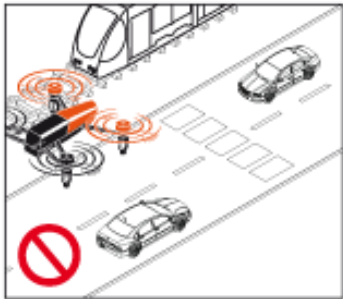
any populous area, such as beaches, other people's backyards, heavily populated parks, or sport ovals where there is a game in progress.

Do not fly closer than 30 metres to buildings or people.



Do not fly in

rain, snow, fog, strong wind or at night



Do not fly

over public transport infrastructures i.e. railways and highways nor closer than 30 metres to vehicles or boats
